

Hungkuang University Incentive Guidelines for Overseas Youth Vocational Training Program Students Applying to Undergraduate Programs

1. To encourage students from the Overseas Youth Vocational Training Program (hereinafter referred to as "OYVTP") at Hungkuang University (hereinafter referred to as "the University") to apply for undergraduate studies at the University, these incentive guidelines (hereinafter referred to as "the Guidelines") are hereby established.
2. The scholarship recipients must meet one of the following criteria:
 - a) OYVTP students who have completed two years of coursework and obtained a Certificate of Completion.
 - b) OYVTP students who have completed two years of coursework and obtained a Certificate of Attendance.
 - c) OYVTP students who have studied for more than one semester and completed registration procedures.

Scholarship Standards

Student Category	Maximum Amount	Distribution Method
Completed 2 years and obtained Certificate of Completion	NT\$30,000	NT\$15,000 per semester over 2 semesters
Completed 2 years and obtained Certificate of Attendance	NT\$20,000	NT\$10,000 per semester over 2 semesters
Studied for more than 1 semester and completed registration	NT\$5,000	NT\$5,000 during the semester of enrollment

3. Eligible students must submit their Certificate of Completion/Attendance or academic transcript (only for those who have not completed two years), along with the receipt for tuition and registration for the first semester of undergraduate enrollment. Applications must be submitted to the Office of International Affairs (OIA) using the designated scholarship application form.
4. Applications must be submitted during the fourth week of the first semester of the first academic year. Each student may only apply once. Late applications will not be accepted.
5. Scholarship amounts will be allocated based on the budget for the current academic year, as approved by the Overseas Student Scholarship Review Committee. The OIA will publish a list of approved recipients.
6. Students who take a leave of absence or withdraw from the University for personal reasons during their first semester must return any scholarship funds already issued. If the scholarship has not yet been issued, it will be forfeited.
7. If any recipient is found to have submitted false or forged documents, the scholarship will be revoked, and the disbursed amount must be returned. Disciplinary action will be taken according to the University regulations.
8. These Guidelines shall be implemented upon approval by the University Administration Council and ratification by the University President. Any amendments shall follow the same procedure.
